# 1. Introductions and Minutes Approval

The 62<sup>ND</sup> meeting of the IREG was called to order at 10:10 a.m. at DVRPC. Thirty-Six members were in attendance. The minutes were approved without correction.

## 2. Presentation

Philip Lutz, a Program Coordinator at the US Census Bureau's Philadelphia Regional Office gave an overview of the 2010 Census and the LUCA Program. In the past, most households were given either a short form or a long form questionnaire to fill out for each decennial census. In order to improve the relevance/ timeliness of the long form, reduce operation risks, improve accuracy of census coverage, and contain costs, programs have been introduced to help improve census data collection and accuracy. The American Community Survey (ACS) will replace the long form as the method to collect detailed socio-economic data. By 2010 the Census Bureau anticipates receiving this data at the tract and block group level on an annual basis. The MAF/TIGER Accuracy Improvement Program (MTAIP) will improve the spatial accuracy of Census Bureau TIGER data and merge their existing Master Address File with this dataset. Other programs like the Boundary Annexation Survey and the Statistical Areas Program will help in obtaining accurate population counts. The 2010 Census Local Update of Census Addresses (LUCA) Program, which is expected to begin in August, 2007, will give state, local, and tribal governments the chance to quality check the Census Bureau's address list and also review/revise relevant boundary and geographic features on a map. Informational workshops on the LUCA program are being offered in numerous locations from March to June and training will be held in the Fall.

## 6. DVRPC Work Program Updates

 Mary Bell announced that Analytical Data Report No. 13 "The Aging of the Baby Boomers: Elderly and Near-Elderly Population Characteristics" had been released and was available online. Copies were made available. Also, "The Aging of the Baby Boomers" policy piece is currently printing.

- Joe Fazekas provided a hand out listing the numerous DVRPC web improvements. Mr. Fazekas also reported that DVRPC's web performance has been improved with the installation of a new server and a software upgrade to the online mapping applications. In the near future, the commission will be developing a records retention policy and disaster recovery plan. DVRPC's IT department has been updating staff PC's 5-10 at a time, and all NT stations are off the floor. Recently, internal meetings have been held regarding updating the census and data bulletins webpages. Finally, DVRPC is scheduled to start a nine-month long process of redesigning their website.
- Glenn McNichol reported that reflights of the 2005 orthoimagery were completed; however the vendor was not satisfied with the results. More reflights have been scheduled. The final sets of geotiffs are on DVD and ready to ship, pending the delivery of metadata from the vendor.
- Will Stevens reported RFP's for the Region-wide Transportation GIS Development Project have been sent out to the top three choices, and the resulting proposals are due on March 23<sup>rd</sup>. A selection meeting will be held afterward in mid-April and a choice will be made in May (tentatively).

#### 7. Member Roundtable

- Gloucester County reported that their online GIS data viewer is expected to go live soon.
  This GIS viewer contains road, parcel (using Mod IV lookups), wetland, and rail data.

- Chester County reported that they are updating their Landscapes Plan. They are in the process of conducting an online public opinion survey, which can be found at: www.landscapes2.org/.
- The City of Philadelphia recently launched an office of emergency preparedness, similar to the federal office of homeland security.
