Highlights from meeting of Wednesday, September 5, 2012

The 84th meeting of the Information Resources Exchange Group (IREG) took place on Wednesday, September 5, 2012 at SEPTA Headquarters, 1234 Market Street, Philadelphia PA. About twenty people were in attendance. Highlights from the June 13th meeting were available as a handout and on the internet.

Presentation

Mike Zaleski, Director Emerging and Specialty Technology, SEPTA gave an overview of various technologies being developed for and by SEPTA. SEPTA hosted their second hackathon (www.AppsForSEPTA.org) in August 2012, where a number of external computer applications (apps for short) were developed, using data provided by SEPTA. The Route Finder app (http://etorbi.com/septa/) allows users to click on their location (or when using a location-enabled device like a smartphone. 'find' your location) and a list of nearby routes are displayed, along with links to printed schedules, nearby bus stops, and estimated locations for the nearest busses. The Schedule Simulator uses General Transit Feed Specification (GTFS) data for published regional rail service, and will similate where any train is on their system at a given time. Users can watch all the trains as they move throughout the day. Users are also able to change the time at any given station, and the app will simulate how that change will look like. For SEPTA's Control Center, this is a helpful tool that fits a need. Changes can be saved to a file for future reference. The Philly Transit Map (www3.septa.org/philly-transit-map/), which is still a work in progress, is a single map that shows everything transportation-related in Philadelphia, including: Google Traffic, all SETPA bus, trolley and regional rail lines, PennDOT cameras, car share pods, and the regional bicycle network. Users can also look at archive data for Amtrak, PATCO, and NJ Transit (to see how these services interact in the city). In the future, real-time flight data from PHL International, photoenhanced intersections.

Some internal apps that are being developed for the benefit of SEPTA Control Center staff were also presented, such as the train view app, which shows the number of trains that are on time or late, yard starts and quits, and timing of trains at various control points and interlockings. Each rail line departure can be viewed with scheduled, estimated and actual times. Train dispatchers can communicate with each other and yard masters using a chat button built into this app. A bus app gives a system-wide look at all bus detours, bus stops, and a list of all vehicles and their current status. All internal apps are being developed for use with touch-enabled tablets, like the iPad.
