



Applications are Now Available for The Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission's Pennsylvania FY2011 JARC and FY2011/2012 New Freedom Funding Round

The Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission (DVRPC) is accepting applications from eligible agencies and organizations for Fiscal Year 2011 Job Access and Reverse Commute (JARC) Programs, and Fiscal Years 2011 and 2012 New Freedom Grant Programs. JARC helps fund transportation services and supporting activities that facilitate access to jobs for lower income persons as well as reverse commute trips for the general public. The New Freedom program seeks to reduce barriers to transportation services and expand the transportation mobility options available to people with disabilities beyond the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990. Both programs apply to existing and proposed services within Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery, and Philadelphia counties.
