Megan Bucknum... Rowan University

Megan Bucknum presented on Rowan University's Community + Environmental Planning program, providing a background on the program, course offerings, and experiences students have at the university. The presentation included examples of student projects to activate spaces on campus and researching access to food outlets in Salem County.
