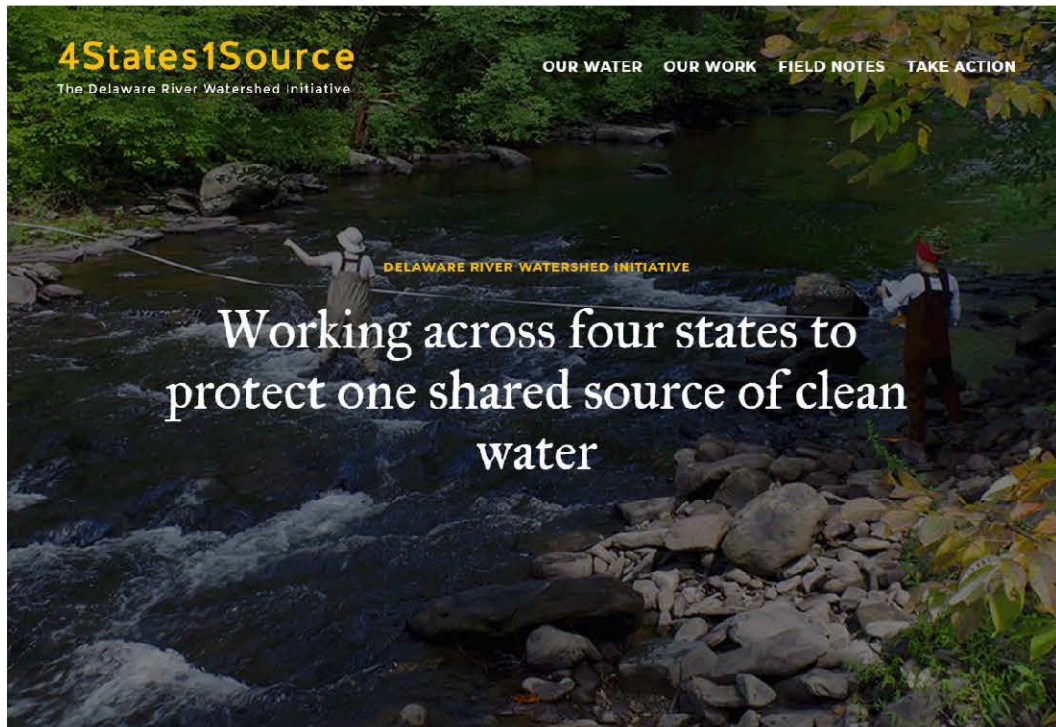

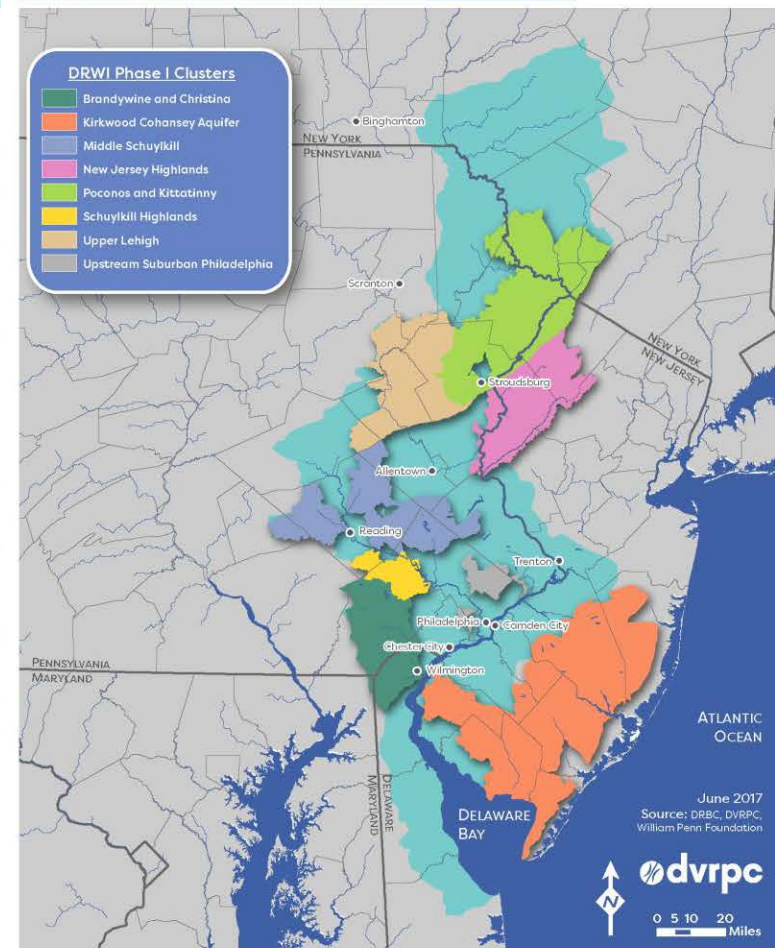

Work Group History

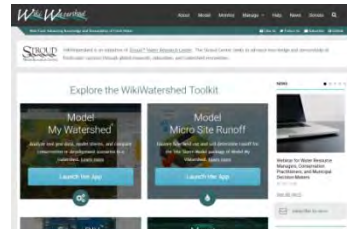
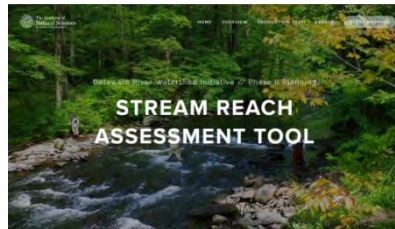
- Convened by  Natural Lands in 2016

 - collaborate to provide technical mapping, modeling, and spatial analysis assistance to the William Penn Foundation's Delaware River Watershed Initiative


What will the DRWI Data/GIS/Modeling Work Group do?
