# 3. Contract Authorization: Traffic Signal Document Control Software for Burlington County, New Jersey

The Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission ("DVRPC") issued a **Request for Proposals** (the "RFP") seeking consultant services to assist Burlington County, New Jersey (the "County") in preparing a Traffic Signal Document Control Software. The goal of the Traffic Signal Document Control Software is to improve Burlington County's operation and maintenance of over 300 traffic control devices, including 227 traffic signals, as well as school flashers, pedestrian flashers, driver feedback signs, and roundabouts. Each of these devices is supported by a range of technical and legal documents—such as electrical/signal plans, timing sequences, resolutions, and maintenance records—which are currently stored in multiple physical locations, including the County Engineer's Office and inside traffic signal cabinets. This decentralized and large paper-based system creates significant challenges for accessibility, accuracy, and efficiency. The ideal solution will go beyond simply digitizing files. The ideal system would be scalable, easy to maintain, and include strong training and support components to ensure long-term success and adoption by County staff and contractors.

In collaboration with the County, the RFP was developed and subsequently released on June 6, 2025, via OpenGov. The deadline for proposals was June 30, 2025. In response, four (4) proposals were received.

As part of DVRPC's standard procurement process, an RFP evaluation committee was created, which consisted of three (3) representatives from the County. Each proposal submitted was evaluated in adherence to the following weighted criteria:

- Technical approach and project understanding (35 points)
- Professional qualifications and experience in similar work (25 points)
- Ability to perform within schedule (25 points)
- Cost Proposed (15 points)

Based upon the evaluation and scoring of proposals, the Evaluation Committee identified **Techna-Pro Electric, LLC** as the top-ranked firm and is, therefore, the recommended awardee.

DVRPC staff will work with County partners and **Techna-Pro Electric**, **LLC** to ensure timely and successful implementation and completion of the project deliverables.

Cost and Source of Funds:

The contract will be for a not-to-exceed amount of **\$500,000**.

The costs are funded from the following source:

Date Action Required: July 24, 2025

Action Proposed:

Authorize the Executive Director to enter into and execute a contract with **Techna-Pro Electric**, **LLC**, with a not-to-exceed amount of \$500,000 for an initial term of seventeen (17) months.

Pursuant to satisfactory performance of the Services, **Techna-Pro Electric, LLC** may be retained for additional work on the project, with costs to be determined at that time. Should additional funding become available for related work, DVRPC may negotiate with **Techna-Pro Electric, LLC** to perform related work for up to two (2) additional years.
