

# DELAWARE VALLEY GOODS MOVEMENT TASK FORCE

### **QUARTERLY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS** 10AM, THURSDAY, JANUARY 20, 2005

Coffee was available at 9:30AM. A light lunch was served immediately following the meeting.

### 1. Call to order

Task Force Co-Chair John Coscia called the meeting to order. All Task Force members were recognized and the October 20, 2004 meeting notes were approved by the committee. Mr. Coscia welcomed staff from DVRPC's sister agency in Atlanta, the Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC), and members of ARC's freight advisory committee. These guests were participating in a two day peer exchange on freight planning at which ARC and DVRPC staff are sharing successes and experiences. (Note: staff from the Volpe Center facilitated the peer exchange and will prepare a summary report.)

It was noted that Toby Fauver has been promoted to Bureau Director of Public Transportation at PennDOT. His interim replacement at the Rail Freight Bureau is Tony McCloskey.

### 2. 2030 Long Range Plan

Michael Boyer of DVRPC reported on the status of the preparation of a 2030 transportation plan for the region. Adoption of the plan is slated for June, 2005. Copies of the *Destination 2030: A Vision for the Future* report were distributed. This report lays out a vision and goals for each of eight issues: Growth Management, Urban Revitalization, The Environment, Economic Development, Transportation Facilities, Transportation Operations, Transportation Finance, and Equity and Opportunity.

Ted Dahlburg also distributed a list of regionally significant rail freight and port projects which were assembled through the efforts of the Goods Movement Task Force's Planning Subcommittee (Kelvin MacKavanagh, Chair). The rail freight and port projects complement the sets of highway and transit projects which have also been identified. In general, the projects promote increased capacities, efficiencies, and intermodal connectivity.

DVRPC's Director of Transportation, Don Shanis, explained PennDOT's request to flex \$9.8 million of federal highway funds to the Southeastern Pennsylvania Transportation Authority (SEPTA) from the FY 2005 TIP as part of a short-term solution to the agency's operating budget problems. SEPTA faces a \$62 million deficit for FY 2005, with a projected \$92 million deficit next fiscal year.

The crisis stems in part from rising costs and less state aid than anticipated over the last decade. In fact, funding shortfalls are projected for all transit operators in the Commonwealth. A viable long term funding mechanism for the state's transit systems has not yet been identified.

In order for PennDOT to flex highway funds to SEPTA, a number of steps must be taken. One of the critical steps is for the DVRPC Board to decide how it wants to use new Oil Company Franchise Tax funds and whether to defer or drop projects. As the Board directs, the DVRPC Regional transportation Committee would prepare and recommend a set of projects to defer or drop.

### 4. Freight Planning Initiatives in the Atlanta Region

Jane Hayse, Transportation Planning Division Chief, discussed ARC's freight planning initiatives. In a high growth region presently consisting of 3.7 million persons and as a major distribution hub, freight is a very important planning consideration.

The ARC freight advisory committee meets quarterly and, in a relatively short period of time, has achieved many accomplishments, such as the identification of freight corridors, bottlenecks, and studies and projects. In addition, ARC has instituted several mechanisms to further incorporate freight into the TIP and long range plan. In the coming years, ARC will be undertaking the development of a major Regional Goods and Services Plan.

## 5. Delaware River Main Channel Deepening Project

LTC Robert J. Ruch, USACE Philadelphia District Commander, discussed details about the proposed deepening of the Delaware River's main channel from 40 feet to 45 feet. The talk emphasized the balanced theme of: *Making way for our ports...Taking care of our watershed*.

The deepening of the channel is needed to maintain the competitiveness of the local ports. Virtually all other East Coast ports have main channel depths greater than 40 feet, and several have plans in place to further deepen their channels.

Dredged materials can be beneficially used. For example, one local application would be as site preparation at the Philadelphia Naval Business Center. Pennsylvania has recently agreed to a more equitable division of the dredged materials that would result from the deepening project.

Many significant development projects are foreseen along or near the Delaware River in the near future. Several entail the expansion or reuse of port facilities (e.g., a SJPC Paulsboro site, PRPA's Southport, and the Crown Landing LNG facility). These projects will promote additional ship activity on the Delaware River, and may have landside infrastructure impacts.
