Meeting Highlights

Welcome and Introductions

Richard Bickel, Planning Division Director, DVRPC, welcomed participants to the meeting and shared his own experience with food system issues and the increasing need to incorporate food, health and other areas into planning efforts. Attendees also introduced themselves and their organizations.

Introduction to DVRPC's Food System Plan

Alison Hastings, Senior Environmental Planner, DVRPC gave brief background on DVRPC as an organization and it's involvement with the food system. She also summarized key findings from the Greater Philadelphia Food System Study, which is currently being prepared for publication. She outlined the planning process that the project will now embark on and introduced Kate Clancy, the featured speaker.

"What Are We Talking About When We Talk About Local and Regional Food Systems?"

Kate Clancy is a Food Systems Consultant and Senior Fellow with Minnesota Institute for Sustainable Agriculture. She presented the common misconceptions or confusion about the words food system, regional, local, sustainable and expressed the need for thinking of transitional models, being clear about values and understanding terms. She also provided some considerations for determining the size and scope of food system planning efforts.

Identifying Our Values for a More Sustainable and Resilient Food System

Amanda Wagner, Food Systems Associate, DVRPC, provided direction for the small group component, including an explanation of ground rules for discussion and a clarification of the meaning of "values."

Small Group Discussions

DVRPC Food System Planning Team led attendees in a small group exercise exploring the values and meanings of local, sustainable, regional and resilient. Specifically, groups were asked to think about the similarities and differences between local and regional and between sustainable and resilient. When the large group reconvened, spokespeople were asked to report on the top values or themes that emerged for each of the four words (local, regional, sustainable, resilient).



Next Steps

Alison Hastings outlined the next steps for the planning process, which will include drafting goals based on the values that emerged from this discussion, conducting additional analysis as needed, identifying indicators and reviewing both indicators and recommendations at a later meeting (tentatively December 4, 2009).
